University Library Has Added Two Useful Databases in Health Science and Related Programs (26/09/2012)

Dear All,

In order to expand the Library's coverage of electronic databases for use by members of the university community, we are constantly on the lookout for open-access (which are free-of-charge) databases that are relevant to the university's curriculum. We are therefore pleased to announce that we have recently added two such databases --

(1) PubMed – Developed and officially maintained by the National Center for Biotechnology Information in the United States, it is a database comprising more than 22 million citations for biomedical literature from MEDLINE, life science journals, and online books. Citations may include links to full-text content from PubMed Central and publisher websites.

(2) PubMed Central (PMC) -- It is a free full-text archive of biomedical and life sciences journal literature at the U.S. National Institutes of Health's National Library of Medicine (NIH/NLM), providing access to about 2.5 million full text articles.

These two databases are widely used by many scholars and researchers in most of the famous universities world-wide with biology, health science and related programs. They will also be useful in our University for similar programs.
